### City of Salem RESOLUTION R18-142

## A RESOLUTION CERTIFYING TO THE LOCAL FINANCE BOAD OF THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY THAT ALL MEMBERS OF THE GOVERNING BODY HAVE REVIEWED, AS A MINIMUM, THE SECTIONS OF THE ANNUAL AUDIT ENTITLED FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

WHEREAS, <u>N.J.S.A</u>. 40A:5-4 requires the governing body of every local unit to have made an annual audit of its books, accounts and financial transactions; and

WHEREAS, the Annual Report of Audit for the year ended December 31, 2017 has been filed by a Registered Municipal Accountant with the Municipal Clerk pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:5-6, and a copy has been received by each member of the governing body; and

WHEREAS, <u>R.S.</u> 52:27BB-34 authorizes the Local Finance Board of the State of New to prescribe reports pertaining to the local fiscal affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board has promulgated  $\underline{\text{N.J.A.C}}$ . 5:30-6.5, a regulation requiring that the governing body of each municipality shall by resolution, certify to the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey that all members of the governing body have reviewed, as a minimum, the sections of the annual audit entitled Findings and Recommendations; and

WHEREAS, the members of the governing body have personally reviewed as a minimum the Annual Report of Audit, and specifically the sections of the Annual Audit entitled Findings and Recommendations, as evidenced by the group affidavit form of the governing body attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, such resolution of certification shall be adopted by the governing body no later than forty-five days after the receipt of the annual audit, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5; and

WHEREAS, all members of the governing body have received and have familiarized themselves with, at least, the minimum requirements of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, as stated aforesaid and have subscribed to the affidavit, as provided by the Local Finance Board; and

WHEREAS, failure to comply with the regulations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the members of the governing body to the penalty provisions of  $\underline{\text{R.S.}}$  52:27BB-52 - to wit:

R.S. 52:27BB-52 - A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars

(\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his/her office."

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and City Council of the City of Salem, hereby states that it has complied with <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 5:30-6.5 and does hereby submit a certified copy of this resolution and the required affidavit to said Board to show evidence of said compliance.

Ed Sasdelli, DCA Monitor, commended the Governing Body and Administration team on their partnership among each other and with the State to provide a balance budget to its residents. He applauded the Mayor and Council for agreeing to apply for transitional aid and being under State monitoring, which allowed the city to reduce its 24-cent increase to a 2-cent increase thereby reducing the average assessed home's tax increase from Five Hundred and Thirty-four (\$534) Dollars to Nine (\$9) dollars. Mr. Sasdelli spoke of the Mayor's positive and collaborative relationship with the State and his recent meeting with the new Acting Director of DCA, where he positively pushed for the needs of his community. The meeting resulted in an increase in aid due to the Mayor's existing plan to bring financial stability and growth to the City.

The Mayor thanked Mr. Sasdelli for help with approval of the aid and being supportive of the City's plan. The Mayor stated the SRN (State Resource Network) grant will help move the City forward with a five-year plan. The Mayor thanked the council for its support. The Mayor and Councilman Groce both stated that the Mayor and Council will always put their differences aside to do what's best for the community.

### MAYORAL COMMENTS -

The Mayor spoke about his meeting with the new DCA Acting Director who was cordial and open to hearing Salem's story and the needs of our community. The Mayor stated that he was very grateful for the opportunity to meet with her.

The Mayor stated that he is working on reopening the grocery store by bringing all parties to the table, including owners, operators and the bank to discuss what is needed to move forward. The grocery store is close to being operable.

The Mayor said he attended Stand Up for Salem's annual event. Councilman Gage and Councilman Smith were also in attendance. There was a County event the same night that featured Senator Sweeny as a speaker.

Council President Roots stated that she attended the County event with Councilwoman Carter and Councilman Corbin in Pittsgrove. She stated that Senator Sweeny spoke about shared services, including school districts, county courts with an emphasis on looking for any opportunities to share services.

### **PUBLIC PORTION –**

Jahyda Villegas said she is receiving information through the council meetings and key communicators. She asked if there was anything else she could do to help the community. The Mayor and Council president responded that sharing the information is most important since she is involved in the community, including Stand Up for Salem. The Mayor and Council President stated that volunteers are always needed for the City's various groups.

Ms. Villegas said that the August minutes are not on the website yet and asked where to get information. The Council President responded that she can always call the City CFO, Dave Crescenzi, for any financial information she may need.

A motion was made by Councilwoman Kellum to close the public portion, seconded by Councilman Corbin. All in favor, motion carried.

# CITY OF SALEM RESOLUTION 2018-144 Resolution Authorizing Executive Session

**WHEREAS**, the Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12b permits a public body to go into a closed session during a public meeting to discuss certain matters as follows:

- (1) Matters Required by law to be confidential: Any matter which by express provision of the Federal law or State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act.
- (2) Any matter in which the release of information would impair the right to receive federal funding.
- (3) Matters involving individual privacy: Any matter, the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as records, data, reports, recommendations or other personal material of any education, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including, but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned.
- (4) Matters pertaining to a collective bargaining agreement: Any matter involving a collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body.
- (5) Matters relating to the purchase, lease acquisition of real property or investment of public funds: Any matter involving the lease, purchase or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds, where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed.
- (6) *Matters of public protection:* Any tactic and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection.
- (7) Matters relating to litigation, negotiations and attorney-client privilege: Any matter of pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation other than in (4) above in which the Board is or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is required for the attorney to exercise ethical duties as a lawyer.
- (8) Matters relating to the employment relationship: Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of , promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all of the individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed in public.
- (9) *Deliberations after public hearing*. Deliberations by the Board occurring after a public hearing that may result in a civil penalty or the suspension or loss of a license or permit of a responding party.; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is necessary to go into a closed session to discuss certain matters relating to the items as permitted by N.J.S.A. 10:4-12b

**NOW, THERFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** by the City Council of the City of Salem that the Council will go into closed session to discuss the following, in accordance with the aforesaid provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act, after which it will reconvene in the public.
